

Expansion of SCIROCCO Exchange Tool for Integrated Care

SCIROCCO Exchange project builds upon the preliminary achievements of the B3 Action Group on Integrated Care of the European Innovation Partnership on Active and Healthy Ageing (EIPonAHA)¹ that first developed the concept of the B3 Maturity Model for Integrated Care. Through the activities of the EU Health Programme funded project SCIROCCO², the Model was further refined and was supported by a validated online self-assessment tool for integrated care. The ambition of the SCIROCCO Exchange³ project is to maximise the value and impact of the Model and the Tool by developing a Knowledge Management Hub to act as a facilitator of capacity-building support for integrated care. The Hub is currently available in 10 languages and has been used in nearly 100 organisations, regions, and countries in Europe and beyond. The increased use and uptake of SCIROCCO Exchange Knowledge Management Hub has resulted in an interest to apply SCIROCCO Exchange Tool for Integrated Care to additional areas of active and healthy ageing such as goal-oriented care, integrated care in nursing homes or long-term care. The Tool has also been adapted to assess the readiness for open innovation and digital neighbourhood concepts⁴.

The objective of this workshop is to explore and discuss and the application of SCIROCCO Exchange Tool for Integrated Care to these additional areas, share the preliminary results of the adaptation processes as well as experience of stakeholders in this process.
